JUNE 2025 POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITY REPORT

During the month of June 2025 the police department responded to and handled 164 calls for service; of those incidents 48 required written reports.

There were 24 State Traffic, 4 City and 12 Written Warnings issued.

There were 16 traffic/non-traffic arrests made.

Officer Michael Duncan has submitted a resignation memo. Michael was hired on May 2, 2024, he attended police training school from August 18 through December 6, 2024 giving me his resignation memo on June 27th, his last day will be Monday July 14th. He applied for and was accepted by the McDonough County Sheriff's Department.

This leaves us yet again with an opening for a full-time police officer. I still have applications on file from our last round of hiring; I will go through those before actively advertising for this position.
