- 2. Ordinance 2025-06: Attorney McCoy presented the Ordinance 2025-06 Oversized Load and how it would work for the City of Knoxville. Alderman Hillier moved to accept the Oversized Load Ordinance 2025-06. Alderman Gruner seconded the motion which passed with six (6) Yes and two (2) Absent.
- 3. Resolution 2025-41 Knoxville Halloween Parade 10-18-2025: Alderman Hillier moved to accept the resolution 2025-41. Alderman Gruner seconded the motion which passed withsix (6) Yes and two (2) Absent.
