OCTOBER 2025 POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITY REPORT

During the month of OCTOBER 2025 the police department responded to and handled 189 calls for service; of those incidents 58 required written reports.

There were 22 State Traffic, 13 City and 5 Written Warnings issued.

There were 11 traffic/non-traffic arrests made.

Officer James Thorp who just graduated from the Macon County Law Enforcement Training Center on August 22, 2025, has already submitted his resignation and left for the Knox County Sheriff's Department. He barely stayed with us 2 months after his training.

Additionally, four part-time officers who would not satisfy the minimum of 8 hours per month to continue employment with us has resigned as outlined in the Personnel Policies for Part-time Police Officers. They received their notice that their resignations were accepted. Currently one of those officers has returned their issued equipment. In some of these cases officers haven't worked hours for us in the past 15 months or better.

As a result of the turnover in employees the station has been re-keyed and new keys have been issued to active officers.
